## VESSEL SAFETY CHECK

The U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary will be performing Vessel Safety Checks during the boating season to issue you a Vessel Safety Check decal for your boat if you pass inspection.

What do we check for in the inspection?

- Proper Display of Boat Numbers
- Registration/Documentation
- Personal Flotation Devices
- Visual Distress Signals
- Fire Extinguishers
- Ventilation
- Backfire Flame Control
- Sound Producing Devices
- Navigation Lights.
- State and Local Requirements
- Overall Vessel Condition

Also during the Vessel Safety Check the Vessel Examiner has an opportunity to discuss with a fellow boater the purpose of the marine safety equipment, to clarify various federal, state and local regulations, to answer any boating related safety questions and to encourage additional boater education.
