## REGULATIONS FOR TITLE 5 INSPECTIONS CHECK LIST (TO BE ATTACHED TO TITLE 5 INSPECTION REPORT)

For all Title 5 septic system inspections, groundwater will be determined by soil mottling techniques by a DEP certified soil evaluator or by actual groundwater observation during the months of March and April in years that the United States Geological Survey (USGS) has determined groundwater levels to be normal or above normal, or a method approved by the Board of Health.

At any site with dual septic systems, separate Title 5 inspection reports shall be filed for each System, this includes laundry pits and greywater systems.

Title 5 Inspections shall include the pumping of the septic tank following the evaluation of the sludge, scum, and liquid levels in the tank.

A system will receive a conditional pass unless a system buried greater than nine inches below grade are equipped with risers on all tank top openings and the distribution box.

When a cesspool passes a Title 5 inspection, it will be considered a conditional pass. A 1500-gallon septic tank and a distribution box must be installed preceding the cesspool before the system is considered passed. BOH permit and inspection required. This requirement does not apply to laundry pits.
