7:35 Legislative Update – Rhonda Nyman – Rep. Nyman updated the Board on the local aid components of the House Ways and Means budget. She has introduced two amendments that would benefit Norwell: funding for drainage work on Rt. 123 and \$100K for the incident stress management fund for firefighters. She also supports efforts to provide more funding for libraries, councils on aging and DDS services for people over age 22. The Board asked for her support to get National Grid to do more tree trimming in town due to the 3 day power outage from trees that fell on power lines during the "NEMO" storm. Ellen Allen asked Rep. Nyman to support three pieces of legislation put forward by Plymouth County, as well transportation funding.
