Norwell Board of Selectmen Meeting Minutes April 20, 2016

2016 JUN -6 AM 11:01

Mr. McBride opened the meeting at 7:00pm. Ellen Allen, Jason Brown, Alison Demong, Peter Smellie and Town Administrator Peter Morin were present.

Motion; made by Ellen Allen, seconded by Peter Smellie, to approve the agenda as written. Unanimously voted

All members reviewed the Warrant, assigning the presentation of specific Articles at the Special and Annual Town Meetings scheduled for Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday (if necessary), May 2, 3, 4, 2016. See meeting notes on 4/5 for a complete list. Mr. Morin highlighted the list of Articles that will be voted as a block. Note: remove the Pathways Article from block voting and move as a separate vote.

NOTE: I arrived late at the meeting, so I missed the STM discussion about who would present specific Articles.

Articles 11, 12, 13, 14 – Related to the Highway Surveyor position

Article 14 – The funding to clean up the large pile of debris at the Highway yard will come from Free Cash. Mr. Morin will present the Article, with backup as needed from Mr. Brown. This pile has been around for at least 20 years and was "inherited" by Mr. Foulsham. The cleanup is part of the regulatory compliance requirements and needs to be addressed.

Article 15 – Road Survey; Mr. Morin will present, backup as needed from Mr. Brown. The main issue to be addressed in the survey is that the worst roads should not be addressed first; rather, roads that need less maintenance should be fixed so that their condition does not deteriorate further. Whoever gets the Highway Surveyor job should have a professionally prepared road status survey.

Article 16 – Ms. Demong will give a presentation about this much needed change, using Article 14 as an example of a recurring obligation and a good reason for the change to an appointed position. She gave a summary of her remarks, highlighting the two part election process and the change of position requirements from manual to technical since the description was written in 1986. The job description states that this is a full time senior manager position with 11 full time union employees. There are only 14 towns left in the Commonwealth with an elected Highway Surveyor position. The three biggest departments, Police, Fire and Highway, function as a team for town emergencies, which clearly indicates the need for a professional level of expertise for this position. Betsy Gordon would like to speak on the charter that originally included this change.

Discussion ensued about likely questions and responses. This is about the department structure and not about the individual holding the position. The timing is optimal for this change, aligh discussion; with an elected position there is no background check or required experience. For questions about the necessity for the change, she will direct everyone's attention to the current status of the roads, highway yard, and gas tank for better understanding. In addition, Ms. Demong will speak about the Tree and Grounds piece of this job, and the level of the departmental coordination that is required with this position. The board advised Ms. Demong to stick to the positive points of the change – this is planning for the future, not addressing the needs of the past.

Article 17 - Main Street Reconstruction Debt- Mr. McBride will start the presentation, and other board members will contribute. Mr. Morin met with Colliers today, and gave highlights of the grading system for the urgency of needed maintenance and repair projects for the Town. Ms. Allen will review the slide presentation for this Article with Mr. Morin before Town Meeting. The School budget overview may have misled the sidewalk proponents; this year's school requirements were over \$1 million. The School Board memo contradictions were discussed by the board. Mr. Brown stated that this sidewalk project has jumped ahead of the 10 years of planning for a new library. More discussion ensued about a slide presentation by the sidewalk proponents. Ms. Allen reminded all that once the original funding source was disallowed the BOS were not in favor of the project as there is no available money. Mr. Morin stated that bond counsel would like a 10 year debt amortization for the sidewalk; Mr. Morin will provide tax amount information for the proposed project.

Article 18, 19, 20 — Billboard Articles — Ms. Allen will do the presentation, providing background and reasons for needing new revenue, as well as laying the groundwork for the next 3 Articles. The presentation will also add the statement "if no new revenue is generated, it will be necessary to cut positions and reduce services". Mr. Morin will help with the presentation. Mr. Smellie will talk to his neighbors on High Street about the billboards, reiterating that they will have NO impact on any residents in that area.



Article 53 – BOS will state that they supported this Article with a 5-0 vote. Town Counsel opposed this Article in 2008, stating that it creates a separate class of property rights and is redundant. However, it is may assist the Town in obtaining additional grant funding.

Article 48 - Note: Mr. McBride will contact John Mariano, CPC Chair about speaking to this Article to reduce the CPA surcharge to 1%.

Mr. Morin requested that all presentation drafts be sent to him by the Friday before Town Meeting.
