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TOWN OF NORWELL

Present: Chair Marynel Wahl, Vice Chair Bob Woodill, Bob McMackin, Ron Mott, Roy Bjorlin, Justin Ivas, Ellen Markham, and Recording Clerk C. Sullivan. Mr. McMackin left at 6:55 PM and returned at 8:10 PM. The meeting was held in the Conservation Office and remotely, as allowed under the Executive Order dated March 12, 2020 suspending certain provisions of the Open Meeting Law, Gen. L. c. 30A §20 et seq. and 940 CMR 29.01 et seq.

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 6:32 pm by Chair Marynel Wahl. The meeting was recorded.

AGENDA ACCEPTANCE

The Commission reviewed the proposed agenda and discussed changes and additions. Chair Wahl added discussions on Gator maintenance and tracking new budget items.

Gator Maintenance

Mr. Mott moved the Gator to the Donovan barn as discussed at the previous meeting, and performed the necessary repairs to make it street-ready. The left forward frame is bent, and will need to be monitored. The vehicle will need budget funds for periodic maintenance and inspections by the dealer. A trailer that attaches to the Gator has a bent left wheel, which Mr. Mott will try to straighten.

Budget Item Tracking

The Commission discussed new ongoing expenses, including Gator maintenance, GIS software subscription fees, and QR code registration. Ms. Wahl will add these expenses to the annual budget.

Cole Peden - Eagle Scout Presentation

Mr. Peden showed the Commission a mockup of the trail markers with QR codes he would like to post at trail heads and intersections on Conservation properties. The markers will be attached to trees; the attachments can be adjusted to account for tree growth and will not hurt the trees. He would like to post a total of 24 markers, two of which would also have 911 codes.

All parties discussed the cost and desirability of registering the codes so they will reference back to a map and update as needed. The alternative is to establish a link on the Commission Web site that doesn't change.

Eagle Scout Projects

Trout Brook

Commissioner Ivas met with Adam Long and wetland scientist Steve Ivas at the site of Mr. Long's proposed footbridge over Trout Brook; they took photos and suggested that the bridge site be shifted slightly upstream in order to maintain Gator access. Commissioner Ivas is willing to provide a basic delineation of the site. He thinks a Notice of Intent will be required, as the proposed work is in a resource area; the fee would be waived, as the work is on town land.

Commissioner Ivas recommends that the Commissioners visit the site; he will continue to assist Mr. Long, who has a couple of years to complete the project.

SUB-COMMITTEE UPDATES

Open Space & Recreation

The revised Open Space plan is nearing completion; Chair Wahl encouraged Commissioners and residents to send in photos of open spaces in town. She will send the Open Space spreadsheet to all Commissioners.

Trail/Signage

Town Planner Ken Kirkland asked Chair Wahl if the "Miller Woods" sign in the office could be posted by the entrance to the property. Commissioner consensus was to leave the sign in the office pending additional work on the parking lot.

CPC

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Mr. Mott advised that he will need to amend the application for the Donovan parking lot expansion from \$70K to \$55K due to cost-saving changes in the project; the new proposal will expand the original lot to 55 cars (2 handicapped), with no incursion on the field.

Mr. McMackin attended the CPC meeting which was held at the same time as the Commission meeting; when he returned, he advised that CPC would be inquiring of Town Counsel Bob Galvin as to whether the Commission's applications for GIS hardware and software and trail crew funding were eligible for CPA grants. The total application pool this year is about \$800K.

Farming

The stone walls are done at Jacobs Field but the walls at Donovan still need work; Mr. Mott will follow up with Hornstra.

Trail Work Update

Mr. Mott advised that the Simon Hill - Hatch Lots connector was almost completed and suggested a different route for the connector to bypass a large hill.

Ms. Wahl visited the property and commented that the required plantings were doing well except for one dead dogwood. Conservation markers have been installed and are well designed and placed.

Applicant agreed to remove green waste from the buffer zone. The matter was continued to allow for Commissioners to visit the site and receipt of an updated as-built plan.

Josh Green, Merrill Engineers, present for applicant, who would like to add a pool to the backyard in existing lawn area outside the 50 ft buffer.

Commissioner Mott recently visited the site and observed several issues, including areas of gravel and fill beyond the approved limit of work, construction debris and a cleared parking area in the buffer zone, a mulch sock draped on top of a stone wall, and a drain pipe directed toward the wetland. Mr. Green noted that Merrill had not been involved in the previous work, and assented to a continuation to allow him to consult with applicant regarding Mr. Mott's observations.
