Commission Priority Projects, Land Management

Jacobs Dam – Jim Boudreau – read a letter by Ken Goode. Mr. Boudreau spoke of study of the dam required by the state costing \$3500. There's \$2000 required for dam repair. Mr. Boudreau said that the dam is owned by Conservation and Conservation is responsible for payment.

David Osborne corrected the ownership information for the dam. The Conservation Commission is allowed to adjust the water level by the gates in Jacobs Pond. The last time, we offered to pay for the survey and would again be willing to pay. He asked Mr. Boudreau to have the correction of the dams' ownership made.

Motion: Bob Woodill moved to expend funds from the Conservation fund not to exceed \$3500 for the proposed survey of the condition of Jacobs Pond Dam, with the stipulation that the Conservation Commission does not own nor control the dam.

Second: Ron Mott In Favor: All

Jacobs Pond Vegetation Control – Bob Woodill said that the first application will be done on Thursday, June 5th with signs up for the restriction of use for that day only. This is a mild herbicide. There is to be no boating, fishing or swimming. There will be two more applications in the future.

Bob Woodill said that Peter Dillon (geologist by trade) asked if the Conservation Commission would be interested in joining him in exploring the possibility of doing a study on the hydrology of Jacob's Pond. David Osborne suggested that Mr. Dillon come before the Commission for an informal discussion. Nancy Hemingway will set up an informal meeting via an email chain.

Simon Hill – David Osborne said that there is a verbal agreement between the Conservation Commission and the Water Department to determine how the 30+ acres are to be administered. A mutual sharing deal. The Selectmen will need a letter from both boards.

Pathways - Nancy Hemingway said that a path was made, while studying the land for perc tests, which she would like to have cleared and maintained for a pathway connection.

Low priority: Nancy Hemingway said that there are two old cross country ski trails on the Hatch lots that she'd like the highway department to clear and maintain.

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Gator - David Osborne said that a new gator was proposed and a compromise was reached with Paul

Gutor - David Ocisime soid that a new gutor was proposed and a compromise was reached with Paul Foldam, in exchange with a letter, to use the old gator. He would like to limit instruction to only a few propic. He suggested shart the members thick about this and disease at the next meeting.

Nancy Herningway suggested spensing with Jim Boodreau about purchasing requirements and arrangements.

Bob Woodill recommended a trail counter for Jacobs Pand and for use in the trail systems. This costs \$199. David Osborne asked that members come in with definitive suggestions for the money at the next meeting.
